A minute of silence was observed to honor those who have fallen and those who remain in harm's way followed by TAPS with Braden Pena and Eric Burks, FHS trumpeter and echo bugler.

It was a great day in every respect that included tremendous community interest and involvement. The Ride of the Patriots proceeded to join Rolling Thunder at the Pentagon where we had the opportunity to support our military and honor the sacrifices they make for us. Most of all we REMEMBER what they have given for our nation. During the rest of the year Rolling Thunder advocates for the benefit of those in the military who have served our country.

The support, cooperation and involvement from the City of Fairfax as well as the County allowed us to conduct a safe and memorable event.
