He also reported on the decisions of the Executive Committee regarding invitations to appropriate speakers, procedures for bringing proposals to the ISCC, meeting with other area ISCCs, and City recognition of the ISCC's 40th anniversary.

Immediate Past President Larson reported on the status of signboard updates. Apparently the City finally has the funds to upgrade the signboard at Picket and Main Street, although no time table has been established. The signboard at the Circle remains an open question in light of the pending redevelopment of the property. Immediate Past President Larson will continue to press the issue.

VOY forms are due to Laura Raymond NLT 7 June. Signup sheet for bringing food is going around – Hildie Carnie will coordinate and send out an electronic reminder as well.

NEW BUSINESS:

A question was raised about the value of sharing individual Club newsletters. The matter was referred to the Executive Committee.

President Conklin will appoint a nominating committee to propose Officers for the 2017-2018 year.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:03 PM.
