Civitan Club of Fairfax

The worldwide Mission of Civitan International is to build good citizenship by providing a volunteer organization of clubs dedicated to serving individual and community needs, with an emphasis on helping people with developmental disabilities.

Currently Civitan is restructuring its organizations, policies, and activities so that they will become even more effective. The restructuring includes moving from a District to a broader Regional approach. For example. our local Fairfax Civitan club is now part of Region4District (R4D), which includes territory and Clubs from what were earlier two Districts. Our R4D Director represents Region 4 on the International Board of Directors, and she also leads and encourages focused volunteer teams (Membership Development, Membership Engagement, Junior Civitans, Planning and Procedures, Marketing and Planning, and Philanthropy.) Each of these teams is made up of people from across the Region who are interested and able to contribute. Communication across the Region and across the emphasis teams is being stressed, with "zoom-like" gatherings, including a monthly zoom leadership meetings/reports/discussion. There are both opportunities and challenges with the new structures. But a lot of good people—including a number of our Fairfax Civitans-- are trying hard to make the new

Hopefully other likeminded individuals will check out our service clubs and perhaps become friends and members.

SCFB is dedicated to helping older adults continue to live independently, and to providing enrichment and social networking opportunities that keep life exciting and rewarding for them. Programs include Accompanied Medical Transportation and Companion Shopping (for older people who are no longer able to drive), Friendly Callers/ Visitors (for people who are mostly homebound), low-cost exercise and yoga classes (strength, balance and flexibility), and Lunch N' Life, Adventures in Learning, and Wednesday at the Movies which all provide mental stimulation and socialization opportunities.

SCFB indoor social activities are restarting. Adventures in Learning starts in April and will be held at Lord of Life Church.




# Soroptimist International of Fairfax County
