The HFCI Annual Meeting will be held at Blenheim on May 10 at 7 Washington and Lee University. Dr. Rainville's topic will be "Doing Their Bit: The Role of Virginians in the Great War." The meeting is open to the public and all are invited to attend. Refreshments will be served.

Al Leightley explained the presentation he gives to community groups on a regular basis to give them some background on the history of the City and surrounding areas.
