We are on the brink of a whirlwind week of book sales. The Friends start setting up for the Children's Book Sale this Friday. That sale is Saturday and Sunday from 10am to 4pm each day. There is no bag sale for Children's books.

The next day we rearrange the tables for the Big Book Sale (Adult fiction and nonfiction and any children's books left from the previous sale.) We have close to 250 boxes for this sale. It will be arranged by Thursday the 11th for the pre-sale

starting at 1pm. Admission is charged for this pre-sale. The regular sale starts on Friday the 12th and runs through Sunday the 14th from 10am to 4pm each day. Sunday is bag day where one can fill a grocery bag for \$8. We have received a last minute donation of 26 boxes of mostly military and history books.

### **MEMBERSHIP**

#### **ADVOCACY**

Elimination of Child Marriage in Virgina – HB994. The bill passed the Virgina House of Delegates and the Virgnia Senate. The bill was sent to the Governor for his signature. Our coalition of Zonta Club of Fairfax, VANOW, Unchained at Last, and Tahirih Justice Center worked together on this bill.

Our current major advocacy project is Sign for ERA. This is a national petition to the Congress asking it to pass a resolution to make the ERA an amendment to the Constitution. The ERA has received the needed number of state legislative bodies to pass it. Virginia was the last to approve to bring the number needed. 2

In Fairfax County, the Fairfax4CEDAW group got the county to adopt a resolution a year or so ago to evaluate county policies and procedures for gender bias using a CEDAW lens. They ordered a gender analysis by the University of Virginia. It was presented on March 22, 2024. This document will be studied by Fairfax County and recommendations will be forthcoming.
